Wholesale resellers sell equipment online to consumers looking to go solar. While labeled as "wholesale," these items will still typically include a markup so that the company selling the product will make a profit. It's currently not possible for consumers to purchase wholesale solar panels directly from panel manufacturers.

One of the biggest benefits of buying from wholesale resellers or other websites is that the equipment is relatively affordable compared to other options when searching for where to buy solar panels. If you're working on a DIY solar project, purchasing your solar panels and inverter through a reseller will be a quick and easy way to get your equipment. However, attempting a DIY solar panel system is not advisable if you don't have the proper expertise. Anyone looking to install their own solar panel system should thoroughly understand electrical systems before tackling the project.

If you buy solar panel equipment from a reseller but are not planning on installing it yourself, finding an

installer can be difficult. This is because many solar installation companies only provide turnkey solutions and will not install equipment they didn't purchase themselves.

Like wholesale resellers, Amazon is another way to purchase solar equipment directly. Many people commonly purchase solar panel kits from Amazon that include the majority of equipment necessary for getting a solar panel system up and running (i.e., wiring, solar panels, the inverter, etc.). Most solar panel kits are best suited for smaller applications, such as an RV or boat instead of a home.

Solar panel kits are often used for off-grid solar panel systems, though grid-tied options are available. It's important to know exactly what equipment you'll receive as part of the kit, as not all solar kits have every component you need. For example, the ECO-WORTHY's 200 Watt solar panel kit includes two separate panels and a lead acid battery. In contrast, WindyNation's standard 200 Watt solar panel kit doesn't include a battery (though you can add it on for an additional price).
