

Electricity bills rome

Feel free to use this resource in order to plan out your energy-saving activities and electricity costs. Here you will find both historical and current electricity prices in Rome.

It costs EUR0.73 to shower for 10 minutes in Rome. If you are showering for 10 minutes once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR21.9 per month. If you decide to reduce showers to 5 minutes, you would save EUR10.95.

It costs EUR0.91 to have a bath in Rome. If you are taking a bath once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR27.3 per month. If you decide to reduce number of baths from every day to every 2nd day, you would save EUR13.65.

It costs EUR5.46 to charge an electric vehicle in Rome. If you are charging an electric vehicle once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR163.8 per month. If you decide to charge your electric vehicle every 2nd day, you would save EUR81.90.

It costs EUR0.10 to run the washing machine in Rome. If you are running the washing machine once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR3 per month. If you decide to running the washing machine every 2nd day, you would save EUR1.50.

It costs EUR0.04 to vacuum for 10 minutes in Rome. If you are vacuuming for 5 minutes once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR1.2 per month. If you decide to vacuum every 2nd day, you would save EUR0.60.

It costs EUR0.04 to use a hairdryer for 10 minutes in Rome. If you are using a hairdryer for 10 minutes once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR1.2 per month. If you decide to use the hairdryer for 5 minutes, you would save EUR0.60.

It costs EUR0.07 to watch 1 hour of TV in Rome. If you are watching 1 hour of TV once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR2.1 per month. If you decide to reduce tv usage by 2 hours a day, you would save EUR1.05.

Once you have bought your property in Italy you will need to connect/reconnect or change name for the utilities. Usually this process could take 5 working days but for very old house (especially for electricity) could take longer.

To get electricity in Italy you need to sign a contract with one of nation's energy providers. If the electricity is still connect in the house it's simpler because it's necessary just to transfer the name from the old owner to you and this process is called "voltura". If the electricity is not yet active it's necessary to make a new contract with the electricity supplier. This process is called "subentro".

There are several electricity providers in Italy and you are free to choose which provider you would prefer. ENEL is the Italian national power company but there are some others you can choose among. In order to set up a contract for the supply of electricity in Italy you need to contact the provider and will require proof of identity, your tax number, bank details and details of your property. It may be simpler to ask the current owner not to cancel their contract and instead to transfer them into your name. (Exclusive Property will provide this service included in the commission).

The standard voltage supply in Italy is 3KW. For most Italian homes, 3KW is sufficient, however if you feel that 3KW is not sufficient you may request an upgrade of the power from your electricity supplier (If a household expects to run a number of appliances simultaneously and exceed the power available a larger supply (up to 6 kilowatts) can be requested). The cost of the upgrade can vary, depending on the provider.
