

Nathan burke news

"After careful consideration, the club has decided to move in a different direction heading into next season, as we strive for sustained success in all aspects of our women's football program," CEO Ameet Bains said.

"He became our first full-time coach after leading the team to finals at the end of 2022, and has developed strong relationships with his staff and players during his tenure.

Burke was outspoken about the reasons behind his side's sub-par performances during the year, claiming a lack of professionalism among the playing group and also taking umbrage with the competition's tiered payment system.

"I thank the Western Bulldogs for allowing me to live my purpose of making a difference in other people's lives - if I did that, then I walk away content," Burke said in the Bulldogs' statement.

He becomes the third AFLW coach to depart ahead of the 2024 season, with West Coast's Michael Prior and Collingwood's Steve Symonds also not continuing in their roles.

Nathan Burke (born 6 February 1970) is a former Australian rules footballer and former coach of the Western Bulldogs team in the AFL Women's competition (AFLW).

A tough rover, Burke is considered one of the most courageous footballers to play for the St Kilda Football Club.¹ Burke set the club record for most games--323--at his retirement, which remained the benchmark until broken by former teammate Robert Harvey in round 7, 2006.² Dozens of concussions during Burke's career led to him using a helmet.³⁴

Burke was co-captain in St Kilda's 1996 AFL Ansett Australia Cup winning side - the club's first AFL Cup win.⁵⁶

Burke had been a director of the St Kilda Football Club from 2008 to 2015.⁷ He had joined the board with fellow player Andrew Thompson.⁸

He is also a regular expert commentator on ABC Grandstand football coverage, an AFL analyst for Fox Sports News, and co hosts the Sunday Session on ABC radio. He is a feature article writer for Inside Football magazine also. This work complements his corporate guest speaking and school programs.⁹

In 2015 he rejoined the AFL Match Review Panel, a role he held prior to joining the Board at St Kilda.¹⁰

In September 2019, Burke was due to become assistant coach in the AFL Women's with St Kilda, but was instead appointed by the Western Bulldogs to their head coach role from the 2020 AFL Women's season.~7~;
